We had approximately 75 guests for our potluck dinner in July with several new friends that representatives of HABcore transported who were living in a U- Haul truck. The mother, son, and daughter touched the hearts of our volunteers, and apparently, we touched theirs. The 90 year old mother, who was affectionally called Peanut by one of the volunteers, smiled between tears and thank us for the kindness shown to her and her family. Our volunteers have made connections with our guests, and this is a powerful experience. We have been able to send home leftovers with HABcore to feed other homeless individuals. We continue to share the evening with the residents living at Homestead Run, Redeem-Her House and special friends form St. Andrew's Episcopal Church.

- Gratitude is extended to the volunteers from SVdP that share their time and spirituality to the Thursday dinners. We are also very grateful for the food donations offered from the Food Pantry. The dinners are the last Thursday of each month.

- In July, Helping Hands cared for 52 families consisting of 113 adults and 85 children with 1,410 items with an In-Kind value of \$6,571.00. In addition, the volunteers assembled 55 beach pails filled with summer toys, etc. (Lots of happy smiles as a result.)
- August was even busier by sharing needed items with 75 families consisting of 173 adults and 115 children with 1,042 items with an In- kind value of \$5,939.50. Additional Ocean County Updates

- Kathy Catron and I have continued to attend the Toms River Housing and Homeless Coalition meetings held on the first Wednesday of each month. Representatives from the local agencies are in attendance, and we share what resources are available for those who are having very challenging experiences with their health, housing, and food. Our Board has voted to continue to offer resources as needed through the Director, Laurie Singer. Some requests have been plastic ponchos, food, coffee, large zip lock bags to hold personal documents and wallets, underwear for both men and women, and cot mattresses.
- I have been offered the opportunity to be on the Board of this coalition. It has been a gratifying experience to date; we also meet once a month. I have been able to participate in supporting some of the positive strides being made to help our neighbors in a most humanitarian manner. More housing is being provided and better health opportunities are being offered. I want to share with you two new happenings:
- 1) The Steven Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation is planning to build a village in Bayville (property bordering Rt. 9 and Sloop Creek Rd.). The village will consist of one three story building consisting of **99/400 sq. foot apartments**, each with a bedroom, bathroom, living room and kitchen, along with a medical facility, physical rehab facility, great room, and resource room center. There will be an additional **24/500 square foot small houses.** This village will be for honorably discharged veterans of any age and rent will be income based at 30%.

2)\$7.5 M awarded for Homeless Housing Programs (copy of article in our conference room)

Current Goals for our conference:

- To continue to build our volunteer base
- To continue fundraising project allowing us to continue to support as many guests as feasible with their current financial challenges.
- To continue to be participatory in working with local county agencies
