Election Time:

It's time...Society of St. Vincent de Paul election process for a conference president

- Each president may serve two terms of office. The term begins on October 1st and ends on September 30th. After the first three years of a president's term there needs to be an election.
- This July 1st due to this being the end of the 3rd year that I have been president, this term ends. Our conference is required to have a nominating committee. I have asked Linda Panaccione, Jill Bradley, and Frank Vaccarino to be the election Chairpersons, and they, in turn, will choose a committee and initiate and conclude the election process. The Committee Chairpersons will report the status of the election at all subsequent conference meetings. During the month of July, the Committee members will actively solicit nominations for the office of President. Those who are nominated must accept the nomination or have their names withdrawn; therefore, the Nominating Committee must ensure that the nominees understand the role and responsibilities of the office they are being asked to serve.
- At the August general conference meeting the candidates will be allowed to present their qualification and plans to the members of the conference. The election will take place in September and the new president will take office on October 1st. The new president will appoint all other officers for vice-president, secretary, treasurer, and Spiritual advisor. If the newly elected president cannot complete the three years of service, the vice-president of the Conference shall act as President until the election of a new president.
